On June 24th we shall hold an Open - Air Fête on behalf of the Church Overseas. Can you see any connection between this announcement and the above heading? There is, you know. How? Well, just think!

The Saviour of the world who died for the world said to the world, "A new commandment, give I unto you, that YE LOVE ONE ANOTHER, AS I HAVE LOVED YOU." If that commandment were obeyed today, would war be possible? People say, "There always have been wars, and there always will be wars." Quite—until! Until what? Until the ABSOLUTE SOVEREIGNTY of the Saviour of Mankind is recognised and obeyed! Now, remember that. After Trafalgar, Pitt said, "You have saved England (physically) by your exertions, you must now save Europe (spiritually) by your example."

The late Charlotte Amelia Knight

She sang in Pyrford choir as a small girl, and she sang solos and obligatoes at many churches and chapels in the surrounding district, including Woking.

Mrs. Knight organised many concerts for church funds and other charities and she sang at social evenings in the old School Room at Wisley.

She did all collections in Wisley for flag days and for the blind. When quite young she did collections for hospitals on West Byfleet station.

Organist at Wisley for 44 years, she played on the old harmonium, until we had the new organ, for which she arranged concerts to help with the purchase of the same.

She was church cleaner for 28 years. The thing which gave Mrs. Knight most pleasure, was helping children, who were in need, and she gave many teas to the Wisley children. Mrs. Knight was magazine distributor for Wisley all the years she lived there.

Mr. Knight is grateful to all kind friends for their sympathy.

PYRFORD WOMEN'S INSTITUTE

Pyrford Flower Show will be held this year in the lovely grounds of Pyrford Court, by the kind permission of Lord Iveagh. After 4.30 p.m. the entire gardens will be open to the public. This was announced at the monthly meeting of Pyrford Women's Institute held on Wednesday (April 12th) in the Village Hall. The President, Mrs. Cooper Simpson was in the chair, and welcomed three new members. Eastbourne was chosen for the summer outing in July. She read a letter from the President of Puha, New Zealand, W.I., inviting Pyrford W.I. to be their link. They said they were a small Institute of about 14 members, mostly busy farmers' wives, from a scattered area near Poverty Bay, but they had been meeting regularly every month for the last twenty years for tea and a good gossip, and would like to adopt Pyrford. It was agreed this would be of mutual benefit and was suggested that Pyrford should try and send them some photographs of places and people of local interest.

It was proposed that the Institute should have a canning machine for surplus fruit and vegetables grown by members. Mrs. Gibson and Mrs. Dyson-Laurie said they would enjoy a course of instruction in the use of it, and Miss Hovenden offered to lend her machine until the Institute could buy one of their own.

Miss Thomson then gave an interesting description of the island of Majorca, where she had spent some months with her mother and sister. They lived in a small cottage on the side of a hill. Conditions were very primitive, there was no sanitation or main water supply, but they had a marvellous native-born maid. She thought nothing of carrying baths of boiling water up and down stairs every day with a beaming smile. As in all Mediterranean countries, motherhood is considered to be
