

He came to Vickers Armstrongs Ltd., on the eve of the pre-war expansion in the aircraft industry and worked on design under men like Walls and Pierson. He prepared for the tasks ahead by taking his B.Sc. at London University. By 1940 he wad evide theoretical and practical knowledge of most aspects of aeronautical engineering.

Ten years ago an Industrial Tent was provided at the Ground on the occasion of this annual event. From then on more firms have assisted us by providing exhibits which gives the public an opportunity of making an appreciation of the development and progress made by these local firms.

In 1962 the local Chamber of Trade co-operated with the General Committee of Parish Day and the result was very good and attractive.

In 1963, at the request of the local Chamber of Trade, the General Committee agreed that, if required, articles could be purchased from the display stalls. It is apparent that this added to the attraction offered by the local traders and the same facilities are, therefore, extended to this occasion, which we hope will again result in an attractive and successful exhibition for 1966 in which 'Mr. Yerbury and Mr. Bills, members of the local Chamber of Trade, have played a great part in organising.
