### EDITORIAL

Dear Friends,

Vicar-designate

Those of us who have met our new vicar-to-be and his wife are looking forward with real pleasure to welcoming them and their family as they come to live and work among us. For their part they are equally delighted at the prospect.

An announcement has already appeared in the local press, but for those who missed it, and also for the benefit of our readers in Kent, Lancashire, Sussex and New Zealand, here are the main details.

The Rev. and Mrs. John R. Lamb have three sons and a daughter. Their eldest son is at present working with OXFAM, the second is an undergraduate at his father's old college, while their third son and their daughter are still at school.

After taking a degree in Modern Greats at Christ Church, Oxford, Mr. Lamb went to Wells Theological College. He then served two curacies, at Tenterden and Hythe, in Kent. In 1955 he put on uniform once more, this time in order to become a Chaplain to the Forces. At present he is Brigadier Senior Chaplain with the 19th Infantry Brigade, Colchester, which carries the rank of Major.

He is particularly interested in Education and in Young People. His sporting interests include golf, squash and cricket.

Naturally everyone is keen to know the date of his induction. This will depend partly on the Army Authorities and partly on how soon minor repairs and essential re-decoration can be completed at the vicarage, but we hope to have John and Barbara Lamb with us some time in the next three months.

#### An Unexpected Answer

When I wrote in the May issue about our community spirit in Horsell I failed to ask the obvious question, How did it come about? I wonder if you know? The answer is — through Christian Stewardship. **"SWEET THAMES, RUN SOFTLY . . ."**

Now that June is here thousands of people will be spending their leisure time drifting nonchalantly down our quiet English rivers. And a very good way of relaxing it is too. But in order that you may drift along so serenely much work has to be undertaken both in and out of season. We asked someone who works for Thames Conservancy to give us a few facts.

The Thames is divided into areas each of which comes under the care of the Chief Engineer's Department. Sunbury Division, for example, deals with the main river and its tributaries below Windsor and provides the necessary organisation for all civil engineering and maintenance projects in that area. These can range from major weir construction to simple ditching.

A principal tributary in this division is the River Wey, and forty men are permanently employed keeping its catchment in good condition. In high summer you may drift along enjoying a calm trip, but in winter you could see mobile gangs from Old Woking or Farnham, using 10 ton winch tractors removing large obstructions such as fallen trees.

These men are experts. Some of them have a lifetime's service on the river to their credit, and know its course in every detail. Experience tells them which key points must be watched after heavy rainfall, and how to tackle blockages under high flow conditions.

None of the twenty-five mills and weirs on the River Wey is operated by Thames Conservancy as the water rights are privately owned, but during floods patrols regularly check each control point. Their gauges play an important part in forecasting flood levels. Readings are transmitted by radio-telephone to Sunbury and these enable the Divisional Engineer to assess the overall situation and deploy his men, as the flood moves downstream. Guildford Mill, for instance, was one of the first to be equipped with an instrument which constantly monitors the river level, and which by coded signals, will automatically telephone warning of a serious rise at any time, or give a reading when called upon.

The work of the Divisional Engineer's Department seldom lacks either variety or interest. Often they work in atrocious conditions, although like the holiday-maker they too have ideal days. Sometimes their scenery is nothing more than an industrial estate; at other times they are privileged to work in quiet and beautiful stretches of countryside.

Buscot, Day's, Temple, Romney . . . do these names mean anything to you? The next time you are on the Thames take note of the names of the many locks and sluices, and reflect on the work of those who ensure that the Thames does indeed run softly.
