

Limited; a Director of British Aircraft Corporation (Holdings) Ltd.;
Chairman of BAC (USA) Inc.; a Director of BAC (Australia) Pty. Limited;
a Director of Europlane Limited; a Director of SEPECAT SA; Deputy
Chairman of Panavia Aircraft GmbH; Chairman of Remploy Limited;
President of the European Association of Aerospace Manufacturers
(AECMA); and a Member of the Council of the Society of British
Aerospace Companies Limited.

Born in June 1917, Mr. Greenwood was educated at Cheltenham College and the College of Aeronautical Engineering. He joined the Experimental Department of Vickers-Armstrongs Ltd. at Weybridge as a Flight Test Observer in 1940. From 1942-1946 he was a member of the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve Fleet Air Arm, serving in the North Atlantic Area, with the British Admiralty Delegation in Washington, DC, USA, and with the Admiralty in London. He continued part-time RNVR service until 1952, retiring with the rank of Lieutenant Commander.

He returned to Vickers-Armstrongs (Aircraft) Ltd. in 1946, became Service Manager in 1949, Assistant General Manager and a Special Director of the company in 1954, Deputy General Manager 1957, and a Director in 1960.

In 1961 he was appointed Sales and Service Manager of the newly formed British Aircraft Corporation (merging the interests of Vickers, English Electric, and Bristol Aeroplane). In 1962 he was one of the original Airframe Directors for Concorde. In 1964 he was appointed a Director of British Aircraft Corporation (Operating) Ltd., and later, Deputy Managing Director of British Aircraft Corporation Ltd. In 1964 he became a Director of British Aircraft Corporation (USA) Inc., the facility he originally set up in Washington, USA in 1954.

originally set up in Washington, USA in 1994.

In 1964 he also became a Director of SEPECAT SA, the joint company formed by British Aircraft Corporation and Breguet Aviation for the management of the Anglo/French Jaguar supersonic strike/trainer aircraft programme. In 1969 he was appointed Chairman of Panavia Aircraft GmbH, the international company formed by British Aircraft Corporation, Messerschmitt-Bölkow-Blohm, and Aeritalia, for the manufacture of the European Multi-Role Combat Aircraft. He was President of the Society of British Aerospace Companies Ltd. between 1970 and 1972. In 1972 Mr. Greenwood was appointed Deputy Chairman of BAC Limited. In 1974, Mr. Greenwood was appointed a Commander of the Order of the British Empire, and in October that year was elected President of the European Association of Aerospace Manufacturers (AECMA).

In September 1975, it was announced that Mr. Greenwood would succeed Sir George Edwards as Chairman of the British Aircraft Corporation from January 1, 1976. Mr. Greenwood joined the Board of BAC (Holdings) Ltd. on October 1, 1975.

On April 13, 1976 Mr. Greenwood was appointed a member of the Organising Committee for British Aerospace and a Deputy Chairman designate of the proposed nationalised Aerospace industry.

Allen Greenwood is a Justice of the Peace for Surrey, a General Commissioner of Taxes, a Freeman of the City of London, a Liveryman of the Company of Coachmakers, and a Freeman of the Guild of Air Pilots, and a Fellow of the Royal Aeronautical Society. He is a Member of the Councils of Cheltenham College, of St. John's School. Leatherhead, and the Cranfield Institute of Technology.
