## ⇒ THE LONDON NECROPOLIS.

BROOKWOOD CEMETERY, WOKING, SURREY.

HIS LOVELY CEMETERY, situated at Brookwood, near Woking, is the largest in England, the most complete in all its arrangements, and unanimously admitted to be an *ideal* burying-ground. It consists of 500 acres of beautifully-wooded land, with large expanses of heather and rhododendrons, and surrounded by charming scenery.

The grounds have been laid out with the utmost regard to order and perfection; trees, flowers and winding paths diversifying the view, and avoiding the monotony of ordinary burial-places.

This Cemetery was established in 1850, being the outcome of a movement which led, and is still leading, to the closing of over-crowded London graveyards.

The Company has a private Railway Station in London, the entrance to which is from Westminster Bridge Road. When within its gates a funeral party is shut out from public gaze, and in forty minutes reaches the Unconsecrated portion of the Cemetery, where there is another Station, with well-appointed waiting-rooms.

After a short stoppage, the train runs direct through the charming grounds to the Consecrated portion, where similar accommodation is provided.


At each Station the train is met by the Superintendent and his staff of trained assistants, ready to bear the Coffin to one of the Chapels, and thence to the Grave.

Adjoining the Superintendent's house there are Monumental Masonry Works and Show Rooms, where designs can be inspected and estimates obtained.

There are also extensive greenhouses, where supplies of flowers and shrubs can always be had; and graves can be planted and attended to at moderate charges.

No more simple, complete, and reverential mode of burial can be imagined.

Relatives may leave their loved ones in this quiet spot, feeling that here indeed is a veritable
